

Report on the Campaign on Swachhata Pakhwada on 18 December, 2022

As part of the 'Swachhata Pakhwada' campaign, waste from residential quarters, Office and Canteen kitchen was properly segregated and disposed off in bins. Vermi compost unit is actively used at the Institute for recycling of farm waste. Electric waste is collected separately for further appropriate disposal. Waste from Goat and Poultry unit were collected at one point and subjected to vermicomposting in the vermi pits. The non-degradable waste is regularly collected by the BMC and the biodegradable wastes is subjected to safe disposal through vermicomposting and utilized for organic farming practices in kitchen gardens of residential colonies. The clean and green technologies and organic farming practices in kitchen gardens of residential colonies was promoted. On the occasion of Swachhata Pakhwada Hon'ble Director, ICAR-CIWA, Dr. Mridula Devi visited the CIWA residential quarters and observed the cleanliness activities going on in the campus. She appreciated the clean gardens and vegetable plots which the residents had maintained. She also suggested for further beautification of the campus. About 20 participants participated in the programme.
